REDEEMER DISTINCTIVES

Senior Thesis — Each senior completes a SEMESTER-LONG research project seeking to apply an enduring question to a culturally significant work or issue in the field of science or the humanities that culminates in a 15-20 page paper and a 20 minute presentation.

Socratic Seminars — Students are active participants in *lively* CLASSROOM DISCUSSIONS designed to help to think more deeply about and respond more eloquently to the topic at hand.

Logic and Rhetoric — Students study FORMAL logic and rhetoric in order to hone their thinking, speaking, and writing skills.

Classical Languages — Students study LATIN in K-9th grade and GREEK in 10-12th grade.

Debate and Oration — Through RECITATIONS, MOCK TRIAL, FORENSICS LEAGUE, and CLASSICAL UNION students learn how to confidently speak in public, and engage others civilly around complex ideas to gain a better understanding of all sides of an issue.

STUDENT LIFE and **EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**
